As a practitioner of Buddhism, my belief system is intricately woven with the principles of mindfulness, the cycle of life and death, and the interconnectedness of all beings. This spiritual fusion profoundly influences my artistic exploration, particularly in capturing the essence of Gede spirits, who embody the duality of existence—life and death, humor and solemnity, fertility and decay.

Through my art, I strive to convey the profound impact of Haitian culture and ancestral religion on my identity and spirituality, offering a unique lens through which the Gede spirits are not only seen but felt, reminding us of our own place within the cycles of life and death.




